What's your program? Thanks for the Memory – Monday Night @ 9pm until Midnight

Why did you decide to do your program? I felt there was a need for music of the 20s to the 60s on air and it has been running now for thirty five years.

What do you love about doing Thanks for the Memory? What I enjoy about the show is the feedback from the listeners through requests, and appreciation of the music I play.

What kind of music do you play on your show? The program consists of material from the 20s to the 60s.

What are some of the features of the show? The show features a request segment plus a half hour radio program of comedy, drama and music.

Are you involved in any other way at the station? I am not involved in any other way at the station at the moment, but have been active in various programs and production over the last thirty eight years.

Originally the Wednesday timeslot from 1.30-2.30 was called Peachey Voice hour, a show that was funded by the City or Playford which included all good things promoted by the Council. Unfortunately after a number years the funding had ceased. The hour remained and since has been Northern Open Mic and the last 3 years has been the Kitchen Table.

One day after finishing an interview on air, Peter had casually said "being on air with us 3 is like sitting at the kitchen table" hence the name change.

The 3 presenters do not have degrees in journalism or media however come from all walks of life and offer a different perspective on every topic each week.

The show is hosted by Sherina Winton, Joanne Baker and Peter Williams.

I had interviewed Joanne about her poetry anthology and she never left, Peter on the other hand was a new trainee who wanted to see how things worked in the studio and never left.

We feel we keep the local community informed on local news, stories and events.
