Welcome to the fireside chat where we go a little in depth with our presenters and their shows.

This month we are interviewing Joanne (Jo) Baker.

Hello Jo. Tell me a little about yourself and the shows that you present on PBA-FM?



I am lucky enough to be a part of three shows that appeared to happen by accident.

I was launching my book of poetry (The Journey to Here, Ginnenderra press, 2013) at Gawler's 'Poets at the Pub' where I met Marilyn Simpson (Host of Easy Does it) Marilyn suggested that I might have a good story for Sherina Winton's 'Northern Open Mic'. I loved it so much I did the training and never left.

Sherina, Peter and I were interviewing members of

Tea Tree Potters when Belinda Martin (amazing artist) said that our format was 'just like chatting around a kitchen table' and our new name was born. 'The Kitchen Table' Then the ABC dropped the only book review show they had and Marilyn had a wonderful idea. How about we host a 1/2 hour show that could promote reading and writing. We began the 'Program Words Out Loud' and I've been hosting ever since.

A year, or so, ago Marilyn, who travelled from Gawler, became tired of the extremely early starts. She kindly suggested that I write a program plan to host my own music show, of music that reflected my personality. 'Jo's show' was created.

I stepped into a board position when I felt I could add a new perspective and give back to PBA

I love being a part of Words Out Loud because I love words, I think everyone has at least one amazing story within them and I love seeing people talking with a passion about their work.
